Kia ora e te whānau,

Finland Trip

It is great to be back in this warm weather. As many parents are aware, I was in Finland over the last three weeks examining their education system and looking for ways to continually improve the teaching and learning opportunities for the children at Ashhurst School. It was a fascinating trip, and I have gained a lot from the experience. Below are some of the highlights that I found interesting not only about the school but also about Finland.

- Finland has now won "the happiest country" title 7 years running
- Finland loves to have saunas. It's a very cultural experience with 5 million people and 3 million saunas
- Children begin their formal education at 7 (Basic Education). Schools are then built for children from the age of 7 years old to the age of 16. Then the children go to the next school.
- Although children do not start school until the age of 7, many of them are in pre-primary (Age 6) and early childhood. Although there is a philosophy of play in these sectors, it is very directed, and children are taught fundamental skills (pencil grips, letter formation, etc.) within these environments.
- Children aged 7 do not go to school from 9-3 pm. Some days, they finish at 12. Children then walk home and, in many situations, will be home alone until

their parents come home.

 Only 11% of people who apply to be teachers are accepted. It is harder to become a teacher than it is to be a doctor. It takes 5 years of university training to become a teacher, compared post graduate programmes in NZ, where you either complete a 3 year teaching degree or a degree + 1 year post graduate program.
